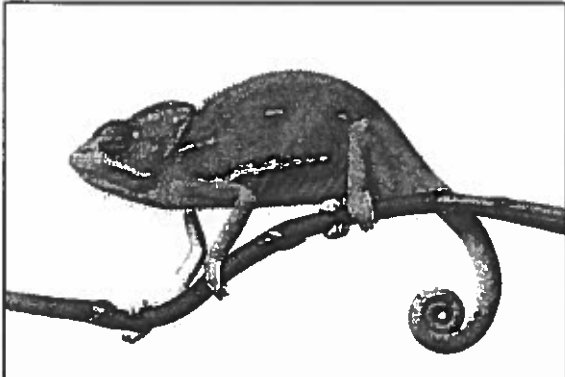

Cool Chameleons

What They Look Like

Chameleons are reptiles that live in warm habitats around the world. They can live in rainforests and deserts.



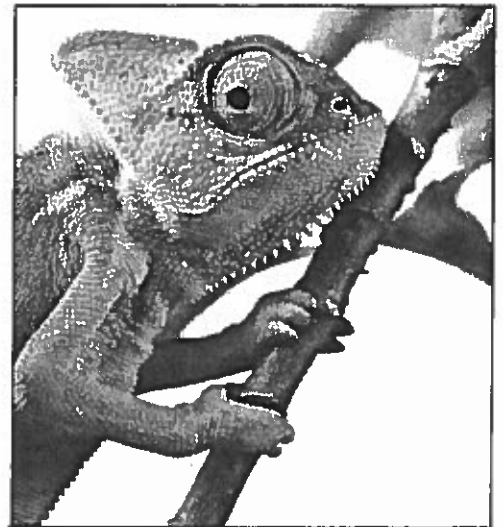
Chameleons can change color because of special cells beneath their skin.

Chameleons are known for their color changing skin. Most people think that chameleons change their color to match their surroundings so that they can protect themselves from predators. Sometimes, they do this, but sometimes, they change their color when they are angry or trying to scare others. They usually turn very dark when they are angry or frightened. Some chameleons

can change their skin color into patterns of pink, blue, red, orange, green, yellow, and purple.

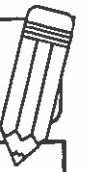
Chameleons have amazing, bulging eyes. They can move their eyes separately and focus on two different things at once. This makes it easy for them to look for prey and predators at the same time. Their eyes have bulging upper and lower eyelids that are joined together. Their pupil peeks out of a tiny gap between their eyelids.

Chameleons also have very long, sticky tongues that they use to catch their prey. Their tongue can be longer than their body! They can stretch their tongue out in less than a second to catch prey.



A chameleon can move its eyes 360 degrees, or in a complete circle.

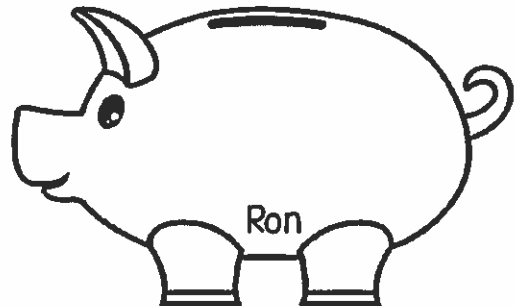
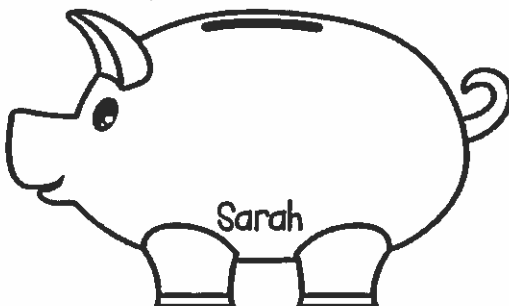
